

A GREMLIN IN A WOODEN SHOE

In autumn 1943, the student tailgunners of Royal Netherlands Military Flying School were at the AAF Gunnery School at Tyndall Field, Florida. One of them, Sgt. Cadet J.L. van Ingen Schenau, got the idea to write a letter to Walt Disney since Disney had designed several cartoons for in use in the AAF. On November 3rd he wrote a letter with the very simple straight forward question: "...we would like to have an insignia for our group. Can you do us a favour...". Van Ingen Schenau made a small drawing in the letter in order to illustrate the insignia.

Disney developed the cartoon, showing the rearward shooting gremlin in a wooden shoe. It became a full hit! The new logo was used on the nose of the B-25s of 'Patrouille Wolff' for the ferry of the B-25s from the NAA Factory to Australia. The cartoon was used on several other NEIAF / ML-KNIL aircraft as well for decoration.

The original drawing went to one of the 18Sq crew members and was used to run a small production of badges for non-commercial use.
